ACRONYM



Materials: Bronze with brown patina

Acronym

This sculpture uses Carl Lutz's acronym in its shape. It integrates his initials in order to create the whole shape. Thus stating that the memory of his rescue actions created something new - new lives.

The sculpture comes in bronze

Recommended height for sculpture - 12 FT

Pedestal height - 2 FT



SAFENESS HOUSE



Materials: bronze with high grade polishing

Safeness House

This sculpture is resembling the idea behind the sculpture Wing #1, but adds ball-like elements which represent the seeds of life that came to be thanks to Lutz's saving and rescuing actions.
This sculptor comes in a smooth, textured or patina bronze coating.

Recommended height for sculpture - 7 FT / long - 11 FT



HEAR O ISRAEL



Materials: bronze with high grade polishing

Hear O Israel

This sculpture draws its inspiration from the most common Jewish prayer, which is used usually in desperate times:

“Hear O Israel the Lord our God the Lord is One”.

It takes the form of an eternal flame – representing the eternal believe in Jehovah - in which is rocked a diamond shaped ball.

The latter representing the longevity of the Jewish people.

This sculptor comes in a smooth or textured bronze coating.

Recommended height for sculpture - 10 FT



SILHOUETTE



Materials: 316L stainless steel with high grade polishing

Silhouette

This sculpture represents an abstract silhouette of a face. It may remind the silhouette of Lutz's face or the face of the people he tried to save.

Thus, broadening and uniting the memory of the saver with the ones been saved or tried to be saved by him – stressing both sides humanity. This sculptor comes in a stainless steel coating, with or without the water effect which emphasizes the element of life.

Recommended height for sculpture - 15 FT



WING



Materials: 316L stainless steel with high grade polishing

Wing

This sculpture takes inspiration of one of the oldest concepts of Jewish believe: Ha-Shchina or in English translate, the Divine spirit. One of the meanings of this concepts is the revelation of God in a realm humans can recognize him.

Thus, referring to Lutz's actions during the Holocaust as a revelation of God in human life while times were desperate.

The sculpture is an abstract representation of a wing, which comes in a smooth bronze or stainless steel coating.
